## Public invited to Clackamas County's Oct. 13 kick-off for two-year transportation planning process

The TSP Experience -- the official "kick-off" event for Clackamas County's two-year Transportation System Plan (TSP) update process -- is scheduled for Thursday, October 13. The 90-minute public meeting is scheduled at 6:30 p.m. in the County's Development Services Building, 150 Beavercreek Rd., Oregon City.

The TSP will include extensive, countywide public engagement and detailed technical work to plan transportation for the next 20 years in unincorporated Clackamas County, including roadways, bikeways, sidewalks, walking paths, transit, waterways, rail, freight, air and even pipelines. The final recommendations from the project, which will also include suggestions for how to fund future transportation maintenance and improvements, will go the County Planning Commission and then to the Board of Commissioners for action and implementation.

Karen Buehrig, Clackamas County Transportation Planning Supervisor and TSP project manager, said "We're very excited about this once-in-a-decade opportunity to work indepth with our residents and businesses to plan the future of transportation in our County. I invite everyone to join us at *The TSP Experience* and throughout the process to help us plan for a safe, smooth transportation future in Clackamas County."

The TSP process includes many ways for people to learn about and provide input into what transportation in Clackamas County should be like in the next 20 years.
