### Building on our assets – planning for the future

**What:** Clackamas County is updating its Transportation System Plan (TSP) for unincorporated areas in the County. The two-year process covers all forms of transportation, including roads, transit, walking, bicycling, rail and air. It is tailored to Clackamas County's diverse geography and planned land uses. The results will be a plan to keep people and products moving safely and smoothly in and through Clackamas County for decades to come, and how to fund that plan.

**Why:** All Oregon cities and counties are required to have a TSP and update it every 10 years. Our County is changing economically and in population. Through this effort, and with your help, we will identify the best ways to build upon our existing system and make smart future investments that increase choice for getting around.

**When:** The planning process is going to take about two years—from fall 2011 through fall 2013.

**How:** In addition to technical work (data gathering, projections, traffic modeling), the updating process includes extensive public involvement throughout the County. This outreach includes a series of regional meetings, workshops and presentations to community and business groups. In addition there will be surveys, newsletters, website, and a public advisory committee.
