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### **Summary of Public Events**

- Tumalo Community Plan (TCP) Open House (Wednesday, May 11)
- Tumalo Walking Tour (Wednesday, June 8)
- Three big topics:
   (1) Speed control & safety
   (2) Pedestrian connectivity
  - (3) Transit stop location




- Concern: Safety concerns at Cook/Cline Falls/Tumalo intersection
- **Opportunities:** Improvements to control speed & increase safety
  - Intersection improvement (roundabout, dedicated turn lanes, raised intersection, etc.)
  - Reposition speed signs
  - Widen shoulder on Tumalo Rd for cyclists, pedestrian, and vehicle turning safety
  - More significant entry statement such as arch at Cook/4th (i.e., downtown Redmond) or roundabout art (i.e., Prineville's new roundabout)






Roundabout draft concept at Cline Falls/ Tumalo/Cook





- Add turn lanes
- Opportunities:
  - Pedestrian facilities (sidewalks, curb ramps, crosswalks, etc.)
  - Cook Avenue intersection improvements





- Entryway improvements at Cline Falls/Tumalo/Cook
  - Roundabout art
  - Archway









Raised intersection @ Cook & 4th

- Signals to drivers that they are entering downtown
- Protection to pedestrians
- Part of Safe Routes to School











Examples of raised crosswalks/intersections






Concern: Safety concerns/conflicts on Tumalo Rd

#### Opportunities:

- Speed limit enforcement (repositioning signs, adding speed feedback signs)
- Widening shoulder on Tumalo Road for cyclists, pedestrians, & vehicle turning safety







Cyclists on Tumalo Road from Google Streetview.


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Transportation

Concern: Safety concerns on Bailey Rd with the new multi-use path

Opportunities:

- Lower speed on Bailey Rd at curve where multi-use path connects
- Widen shoulder on Bailey Rd



Planned roundabout at US20/Cook and multi-use path from Bailey to 4<sup>th</sup> Street.

### **Pedestrian Connectivity**

- Concern: Several gaps in current sidewalk network
- Opportunities:
  - Sidewalk infill focused on Safe Routes to School
    - ✤ Bruce from 4th to 7<sup>th</sup>
    - ♦ Cline Falls Hwy
    - Tumalo Road
  - Walking loop


Projects identified in the draft TSP shown in **purple**. Additional potential projects shown in **red**.











### Walking Loop


- 1-2 mile paved walking loop through Tumalo using new underpass and Tumalo Trail
- Extension of fitness trail to 4<sup>th</sup> Street
- Connection from new multi-use path, through roundabout, to Tumalo core
- Extend trail from State Park to downtown core





### Transit Stop

- Transit vehicle will be a Ford Transit van (Max. 8 people)
- Possible locations:
  - (1) On 4th, shared location with school busses
  - (2) Country store (on 5<sup>th</sup> near Cook)
  - (3) Bruce Ave across from church
