Subject: Final Public Meeting #1 Summary

INTRODUCTION

This outreach report summarizes the outcome of the first public meeting for the Curry County Transportation System Plan (TSP) Update. The purpose of the public meeting was to introduce the public to the project and its goals, present findings from the current roadway inventory and transportation system operations analysis, and gather input from the community about their transportation needs. This feedback will be incorporated into the existing conditions analysis and the upcoming future conditions and alternatives analyses for the TSP.

The public meeting was held at the Curry County Administrative Annex in Gold Beach on Wednesday, March 15, 2023, from 5:30 to 7:30 PM. The public was notified about the event with the following mechanisms:

- A post card that was posted to the Curry County Board of Commissioners website, the County Planning and Building website, and on bulletin boards at the Planning Department, and emailed to the County's land use list of interested persons.
- Announcements were posted in various places on the project website
 (https://projectcomment.com/currycountytsp) including 'Home,' 'Latest News,' and 'Meetings,' which automatically sent notifications to website subscribers.

For future public meetings, the Board of Commissioners encouraged the project team to advertise on social media and offered to announce meetings during their Wednesday workshop periods that precede the events.

The in-person event garnered six (6) participants outside of the project team including two community members, two City of Gold Beach representatives, a County Board Commissioner, and a County Planning Commissioner. The project team was also able to gather input from a deputy at the Sheriff's Department following the open house.

For community members who preferred to participate online, a virtual public meeting that provided the same content as the in-person event was available and advertised through the project website from March 15 to March 31. In addition, community members were informed about an interactive commenting map that is available on the project website and will be for the duration of the project. The following section summarizes the feedback received during the in-person and virtual public meetings and through the interactive commenting map.

PUBLIC MEETING FEEDBACK

Large format poster boards were displayed at the in-person event that presented project background information, the draft TSP goals, maps that illustrated the various elements and conditions of Curry County's transportation system today, and the next steps in the project and how the community can stay involved. Comment forms were also provided for participants to complete.

Between the in-person and virtual events and the project website interactive commenting map, the public identified approximately 14 needs for the County's existing transportation system. These needs generally represent safety for all users, the vehicular system, and the walking and biking system. An overview of the feedback received is summarized below. Public meeting materials and public input are attached to this summary.

- There is general concern for/interest in roads that are federally classified as collectors but are currently gravel (Lobster Creek Road was an example).
- There is general concern for the lack of redundancies in the transportation network; there's only one way in and one way out.
- Agness Road up to the town of Powers may be an ideal alternate and/or emergency route.
- The major County roadways that follow the rivers (S / N Bank Chetco River roads, Jerry's Flat Road, N Bank Rogue River Road, etc.) tend to be locations of frequent stops for the Sheriff's Department.
- The Cape Sebastian State Scenic Corridor on US 101 (south of Gold Beach) can exhibit unsafe roadway conditions during inclement weather.
- Visitors to Secret Beach create parking issues/conflicts on US 101.
- US 101 / Winchuck River Road-Ocean View Drive: heavy traffic turning movements at this intersection; may need a traffic signal.
- US 101 / Del-Cur Supply Co-Op site access: southbound left-turn onto the site is
 problematic after changes were made to the highway. There's only one driveway in;
 people must pull into a turn lane going the wrong direction or cause a major back-up on
 US 101 and unsafe passing on the right.
- There are several observations for US 101 through the Brookings Urban Growth Boundary (UGB):
 - US 101 / Carpenterville Highway-Dawson Road (site of the lumber mill): very difficult to pull onto US 101; intersection needs a traffic signal.
 - US 101 / 5th Street: various nearby land uses causing major traffic, crashes, and near misses at this signalized intersection.
 - US 101 / Oak Street: part of a major walking/biking route to and from schools and a lot of traffic entering US 101; needs a four-way stop and signaled crosswalks.
 - Need better street lighting along the US 101 bridge over the Chetco River for all the foot traffic.

- US 101 / S Bank Chetco Road on-ramp: RV's move directly into far right lane, often without stopping, and cause slow-downs; need a merging lane.
- Inadequate on-site parking for the South Coast Humane Society Thrift Store causes patrons to park on US 101 shoulder and create issues for southbound traffic, especially when they pull back on US 101 across four lanes to travel northbound. Wider shoulders might help.








Are there roadways that need additional lanes or wider paved shoulders?













What areas have the greatest need for pedestrian, bicycle, and transit facilities and services?









STATION 7: TSUNAMI INUNDATION ZONES






STATION 8: COUNTY DEMOGRAPHICS



Which areas have the greatest need for alternative travel modes?








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


Which areas have the greatest need for alternative travel modes?










STATION 11: INTERSECTION AND SEGMENT CRASHES (2016-2020)




Are there other intersections or roadway segments that seem unsafe?



STATION 12: PEDESTRIAN & BICYCLE SYSTEM PERFORMANCE






STATION 13: PEDESTRIAN & BICYCLE SAFETY RISK


In each "room" (or tab) located at the top of this page, you will find various information that will collectively support updating the County's TSP. This is where we need your input. The rooms include:


- About the Project: provides general information on the project, including "What is a Transportation System Plan and why does it need to be updated?"
