

Summary of Feedback from Citizens on the "Transportation Priorities" DRAFT 11/3/11

Overview

Over the past three months, Clackamas County staff has attended over 20 community meetings to inform people that the Transportation Systems Plan (TSP) is being updated and to get input from them what elements (goals) should be a priority when the transportation system is being planned and evaluated.

To get input from the public, a survey was developed that broke the concepts identified in the draft goals into simple language. People who attended the community meetings were then asked to mark what ever element they thought should be a priority when planning and evaluating the transportation system.

General Trends

Overall, the areas where there was strong support that the transportation system should:

- Fix existing roads first
- Build for the future, not just the present
- Provide choices for all regardless of ability, income or age
- Connect people to jobs and services
- Support biking and walking
- Offer options for commuting to work

The items that had the least support were:

- Providing ways to maintain and improve health
- Enhancing the existing system
- Customizing solutions for local needs
- Supporting local business

Some of the major themes that can be gleaned from the comments are:

- There are strong differences in opinions about cyclists; both that facilities should be
 provided for them in rural and urban areas, as well as that there shouldn't be an
 emphasis on facilities for bicyclists.
- There are strong differences in opinion on green house gas.
- The need for transportation for frail and elderly was reiterated.
- A few items that were brought up that may not be adequately addressed in the goals include horses travel, and the impact of roads on the natural environment.

Fiscal Responsibility

- Transportation costs should be shared by everyone on the road. If you use it
 you should pay for it. Motorists shouldn't have to pay for bike lanes and vicea-versa.
- Suggestions: Allow volunteers to help. Accept donations that have been offered.

Livable and Local Communities

- Safety for bicyclists on rural roads (and pedestrians and equestrians)
- Suggestions:
 - Seattle model: on narrow roads, make bike line (striped) extra wide
 - Concerns about the safety of cyclists along major roads like Johnson Road and Willamette Falls Drive, Borland, Rosemont
 - Safety in general for cyclists on rural roads
 - Sign rural roads for peds, bicyclists and equestrians (don't postpone after urban areas)
 - Utilize for peds, bicyclists, equestrians those ignored, mapped, unpaved public roads, trails, railroad right-of-way

Other: Concerns about congestion

Health & Safety: Islands on Hwy 99 like on Oregon City's 7th St -- have volunteers put them in.

Local Businesses & Jobs

- We need to bring people and jobs closer together.
- We need to listen when communities say no to rail.

Equity

- We need to give people options.
- Non-motorists need full safety & good statistics (no more accidents than cars)

- Treat bicyclists like 1st class citizens
- We need balance between motorists and bicyclists; not special accommodations for bicyclists
- Not 1% for bikes -- bikes 1st.

Sustainability

- Decrease greenhouse gas emissions -- if we don't do this, the world will be a
 desert
- Our best climatologists say time is running out for our climate.
- ...And our pocket books say time is running out for our budgets
- Suggestions:
 - Job exchanges (like Craig's List) to get people near their jobs; work with employers, too
 - Carbon tax
